

TextExpander expansions for

@due
@start
@alert

in which you can type or informal relative dates and date adjustments like today +7d , jul 14 , tomorrow 2pm , Or next month into a TextExpander field, and which creates corresponding expansion in the pattern of

- @due(2015–12–18)
- @start(2016–07–14)
- @alert(2015–12–13 14:00)

Use

- Install in TextExpander
- Type @due or @start or @alert followed by a space
- Enter a relative or informal date in the TextExpander field which appears

Types of phrase recognised

Symbol	Description	Examples
now	Current system time	now +8h (<i>8 hours from now</i>)
today	Time set to 00:00	today +2w (<i>in two weeks</i>)
yesterday	Defaults to midnight of yesterday	yesterday, yesterday 3pm

Symbol	Format	Examples
<i>dayname</i>	sun, mon, tue, wed, thu, fri, sat [or full forms]	thu 2pm, next sat, next saturday
<i>current time</i>	now	now +2h
<i>months</i>	jan, feb, mar, apr, may, jun, jul, aug, sep, oct, nov, dec [or full forms]	jul 14 , 1 may
<i>relative</i>	next, last, +[number][unit] , -[number][unit]	last month, today +2w
<i>intervals</i>	m[in], h[our], d[ay], w[EEK], [m]o[nth], y[ear]	today +1y, july -1w
<i>time settings</i>	H, M, a(m), p(m)	2H 3pm 8am 8.30am 16:00

Dates	Description	Examples
<i>ISO</i>	yyyy-mm-dd [HH:MM]	2014-07-14 +6w (six weeks after that day)
<i>Informal months</i>	Defaults to midnight at the start of the first future month of this name	aug (<i>the first future august – next year’s aug if we are already in this year’s</i>)
<i>Informal days</i>	Preceding or following the name of the month, and assumed to be in the future	feb 12, 12 feb (<i>next year if the current date is after feb 12</i>)
<i>Informal years</i>	Before or after the month and day. Assumed to be the first future instance of the date) if omitted	12 June, 2015 june 12, june 12 2015
<i>Last</i>	most recent past instance	last wednesday, last jan 12, last month (<i>midnight at the start of the month before this</i>)
<i>Next</i>	soonest future instance after the current week	next friday (not the friday at the end of this week, if one remains, but the following friday)
